

from year to year, because new states and territories are rapidly creating new centers of manufactures. A few CHOICE GROCERIES, years ago, the great center of flour manufacture was in what was called PROVISIONS. the Genessee country, with Rochester as the chief city of the flour trade. Now the center of this interest has been transferred to Minneapolis, on the west side of St. Anthony falls. It is probable that the central interest will be maintained there for many years. But it cannot be permanent, for the wheat-producing center is confor the wheat-producing center is constantly pushed further into the north-west. But at Minneapolis the great improvements in the milling of wheat have originated. Better flour and more of it was the result. The roller process has taken the place of the grinding process by burr millstones. Hereafter the center of flour manufacturing will steadily follow the center of wheat production. That is inevitable. A few years ago this theory would have been sharply questioned. But railroads have penetrated all the great wheat-growing districts. Where finel is chean there will be no diffifuel is cheap there will be no diffi-culty in erecting flour mills in the more important wheat-growing districts. There will, of course, be many local centers of flour manufacturing

because at present wheat-growing is extended over a large area. They have been making new figures on the coal supply, and it is now be-lieved that it will take 11,000 years to exhaust the supply even if you don't
