"Oh, yes," remarked a sharp-faced, prosperous looking passenger, "Dakota is a great country. I've just come from there. It's going to be a great farming region, and there will be good towns up there by the hundreds. That's my business—starting new towns. Money in it? I should say so. What do you think? I don't sell. No, sir; I've sold a lot for my friends, but I don't sell myself. You can have the title deeds of a dozen right now if you want 'em. No, sir; the man that tries to sell town lots in Dakota gets left."

A FINE COUNTRY.
Writing from Deep River, Wakkanau county, W. T., under date of August 13th, Mr. H. A. Shaw sends with some splendid fruit raised on his place, an interesting letter from which the following is an extract: Besides being considerable earlier, you will note the flavor of this fruit; it has neither been steam-baked nor trucked to death; it came off the tree two hours ago. Six years ago there was scarcely a fruit tree on Deep River, and hardly ground enough cleared to put one. New settlers are coming in every day for Salmon creek and the Nasel country. I was out there a few weeks ago and found a great deal of improvement going on; what was wilderness two years ago is now turned into large fields of hay, oats, potatoes and turnips. There is also a large number of stock, and a few steamboat landings together with warehouses and besides, a good steamboat landing at Gray's bay. A good wagon road has just been completed from the forks of Deep River to Salmon creek and the Nasel. We are pushing our way here through to the Willapa country. The day is not far distant when passengers and mail will arrive at the forks of Deep River from the Willapa daily.

CHIEF, Aug. 13.—Peter Smith, of this place, died yesterday from injuries received by a wagon running over him on the 11th, while hauling out from his field. He was thrown from his wagon between the horses, and one of them kicked him severely. The wheels then passed over his body, causing injuries which resulted in his death. He leaves a wife and two children.

FORT BENSON, M. T., Aug. 13.—Desmond and Damas, on a mission for the U. S. army, are said to be organizing a strong force of dragoons to make a dash on Regina, stir up the natives and return under the leadership of their former chief, Riel. Both hate the sympathy and assistance of the natives, and their scheme is deemed entirely practicable.

LIMA, via G. Iveson, Aug. 12.—Trujillo was occupied by government troops without resistance, the Montenegro having retired to the interior. A fight took place on the 31st inst., between a body of government troops numbering fifty and a party of Montenegro. The latter were defeated and eight of their officers taken prisoners.

PARIS, Aug. 13.—The *Republique Francaise* mentions that an Anglo-Chinese alliance, offensive and defensive against Russia, has been perfected. The journal contends that if England concludes a similar alliance with Turkey, war with Russia will be imminent.

LOUISIANA, Aug. 12.—Letters from Suakin say that the troops are dying like flies.
