BISMARCK'S EYE ON CUBA.

London, Aug. 31.-Additional sensation is being attached to the Span-ish-German difficulty by a rumor giving Prince Bismarck's reason for the seizure of the Caroline islands. This rumor attributes to the chancellor a determination to obtain possession of Cuba, and explains his conduct in taking the Carolines as a ruse to secure an understanding between the United States and Germany, regarding Span-ish outlying possessions, as a result of which Germany would permit the United States to secure the Phil-lippine islands if the Washington government would consent to Ger-many's annexation of Cuba. It is strongly maintained in some quarters that Bismarck has for a long time had his eye on Cuba and that he has assured himself of the support of certain western America sugarinter-ests in this scheme. Englishmen of moderate views scout the idea that the United States will ever permit any German occupation of Cuba, and affect to perceive in this reported Bismarckian project a deeply designed intrigue to involve the Americans in a European squabble. This story comes from Paris, where it is extensively discussed. The Spanish colony in the French capital are furiously in-dignant over the whole thing. The l'agblatt, of Berlin, in reference to the matter to-day, remarks that the beautiful ladies of Cuba will soon be ovely subjects of Emperor William. King Alfonso has been informed by telegraph of the reported Spanish occupation of Yap, the principal of the Caroline island. He will return from San Ildefonso to Madrid on Momday, to preside over a special meet-ing of the Spanish cabinet, called to consider the Carolines affair.

Peace Almost Assured.

London, Aug. 31.-It is almost certain that peace between England and Russia, on the Afghan question, is now completely assured. The two governments are at present busily en-gaged in arranging the last details of a mutual understanding, and nego-Conneil will issue warrants for the conlection thereof.


