No Chinese Need Apply.

SEATTLE, Sept. 9.—The latest news from Squak, the scene of the attack on the Chinese hop pickers on Monday night, is that the attack was made by white men and not by Indians as previously reported. The attacking party crept into the camp at the dead of night while the unsuspecting Chinamen were asleep. The first intimation which the Chinamen had of the presence of the enemy was a volley of shots from rifles and revolvers fired directly into their tents. The attacking party numbered about ten. The Chinamen were not hit at the first fire, and all fled into the brush, while their assailants, with yells and oaths, fired into one tent after another. Three Chinamen were killed outright and four wounded. Most of those who succeeded in escaping made their way through the woods to Newcastle, and were brought to this city by train. They are all greatly terrified at the outrage. The attempt to introduce Chinese labor in the Squak hop fields has been given up, and the remaining Chinese will be brought to this city as rapidly as possible.

The Grant Memorial.

NEW YORK, Sept. 10.—The Grant memorial fund drags heavily along. The total subscriptions so far are \$72,650. The largest sum contributed yesterday was \$250 by S. J. Tilden. The Times and other papers continue to plead the national character of the fund and the patriotic object. It says the sum required could be raised in a very short time were personal application made to the wealthy men of the country, who greatly esteemed General Grant, but the monument raised thus will not carry out the idea with which the association having the matter in charge intended. The committee, therefore, reiterates their former appeal to the patriotic people of the United States, and hope that a generous response will be made. They would much rather receive \$100,000 from 200,000 people than the same amount from a single opulent citizen.

No Hope For Kiel.

CHICAGO, Sept. 9.—Daily News' Winnipeg special: The full court of Manitoba, composed of Chief Justice Wallbridge and Justices Taylor and Killman, today gave a judgment on the Kiel case, disallowing the appeal and confirming the sixth sentence passed by the northwest territory court. All held that according to the evidence the jury could not come to any other decision than they did; that by the dominion statute, confirmed by the imperial parliament, the northwest territory court clearly had jurisdiction, and that while the prisoner acted strangely at times, he is a clever, designing man, who sought to advance his own personal interests by using the half-breeds as tools. There is a growing conviction in Winnipeg that Kiel will be hanged on the 18th.

LONDON, Sept. 9.—A dispatch from Madrid to the Times says: Emperor William has sent a dispatch to King Alfonso saying that he has no intention of trenching upon Spanish rights, and will do nothing to prejudice his old friend Alfonso; that Germany will withdraw from Yap, abandon all designs on the Caroline islands and admit Spanish sovereignty over these islands provided it be made effective.

ST. PETERSBURG, Sept. 9.—The statement is made that the Russo-Afghan question will be speedily embodied in a protocol defining the main points of the frontier. The Afghan frontier commission will then define the boundary line in detail. Russia has abandoned her claim to the whole of Zulfikar Pass and Maruchak. The Afghan frontier line will run eastward to Kadjia Saleh.

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—Emperor William has received a long and pressing letter from King Alfonso respecting the Caroline question and the situation of affairs in Spain growing out of it. The details of the letter have not been learned yet, but the contents greatly impressed Emperor William, Empress Augusta and Crown Prince Frederick William.

LONDON, Sept. 9.—Considerable surprise and regret has been occasioned here at the tone of Vice-President Hendrick's speech at Indianapolis last night, siding with Mr. Farnell in the latter's issue with England. It is urged by British politicians that, owing to his position, he ought to have taken a neutral stand.

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—Much uneasiness is felt here owing to the possibility that other German vessels in the Pacific under orders to annex the Caroline may come into collision with Spanish men-of-war.

Northern Pacific Election.

A dispatch from New York says: "Some fresh complications are expected in the Northern Pacific elections. Bratton Ives, who was defeated by Elijah Smith in the Oregon Navigation elections, is likely to have something to say as to how the Oregon and Transcontinental shall vote its 120,000 shares. The vote of the trustees being uncertain, the Oregon and Transcontinental is rapidly soliciting proxies. The latter company has two directors on the board now, but is entitled to three. President Smith will be opposed by the Wright interest, although he has about 80,000 shares now, on account of his desire that the Cascade branch of the Northern Pacific shall not be built immediately. It is for the interest of the Oregon and Transcontinental to keep as much business as possible on the Oregon Navigation line. It is said that the Rock Island interest controls stock enough to entitle them to two directors."
