FEARFUL CONFLICT WITH A BEAR.

The Snohomish Champion brings the Snohomish Champion of a bear the following particulars of a bear fight on the Lummi. An Indian by the name of George Placid had wounded a large bear with a shot gun and returned for assistance. He gun and returned for assistance. He placed and Skin Ulsaase from Pimples to Scrofula. John Kanam. Seeing Placid the animal made for him; standing on his hind legs the bear made for the Indian's throat, who as quick as he could get the gun pointed, shot the bear in the breast. But Mr. Bruin paid no attention to that except to close in on Placid, who threw up his arm which the bear caught in his mouth and was pawing right and mouth and was pawing right and left when Kanam reached the spot; left when Kanam reached the spot; running up he gave the full charge of shot into the bear's side, but he was so mad and furious that it did not seem to weaken the animal whatever. Letting loose of Placid, it made an attack on Kanam with its mouth open, into which the Indian ran the muzzle of his gun as far as he could, guarding himself in that he could, guarding himself in that way and receiving some bad scratches on the arm and person. In the meantime, Placid, with what little strength he had left, reloaded, and taking deliberate aim at the bear's head, killed it instantly. They all say that it is one of the largest bears that has ever been killed in that part of the country. It is very doubtful whether Placid lives. His flesh was hanging like strips of rags, and the bone in his arms and legs could be seen in several places, he is between life and death. I nam is able to get around and thinks that he is lucky to get off so fortunate.

A Hazardous Feat.

A week or two since Chas. D. Matheny, living out near Minter, for the entertainment of some "city folks," chopped down a tree forty-five feet from the ground. That is to say, the stump of the tree now stands forty-five high, and is probably the highest stump in Washington territory. Mr. Matheny's method of climbing a tree ax in the tree above his head, and by grasping the handle and by support-ing his foot in the lower notch he places the board in the notch above and then climbs upon it, and thus goes to any hight desired. Joe Hopfentz, who was present when the above feat was performed, made a rough but highly creditable picture of the scene, and it is on exhibition. It represents Mr. Matheny hanging by his hands underneath his board while the tree is falling. At that height it would be impossible for a man to keep his footing on the board, as the great stump quivered when the tree fell, like a twig in the wind .- Tacoma
