THE YACHT RACE.

English or American Supremacy Still a Question.

The race for "the Queen's cup" between the American yacht Puritan, and the English yacht Genesta, is at present writing undecided.

All over the United States and England the greatest interest is manifested in the contest between the two yachts, the highest skill and the utmost perfection yet reached in the art of yacht sailing.

The finest glories of American yachting cluster about the great international races which have been sailed for the possession of the Queen's cup.

The first international challenge was issued in 1837 by Joseph Weld of Bywell, England.

The ocean and international races in which the Henrietta, Cambria, Sappho and Davallies were engaged, occurred between 1867 and 1871.

The third contest was in 1871. The Leona, owned by James Ashbury, commodore of the Royal Harwich yacht club, was then looked upon by the British with the same hopes which in the hearts of American yachtsmen centered about the America.

In 1876 the fourth contest for the cup was provoked by the Canadian schooner, the Countess of Dufferin.

The cup is of solid silver, six-sided and elaborately ornamented. It stands full two feet high and weighs at least 100 ounces.
