The Pacific Journal learns that the following log came on and in the vicinity of the Willapa river have been and are in active operation this year. Freeman Albright, at Elk prairie, employing eight men; Wallace Campbell, on Fern creek, nine or ten men; Wm. Walker, at Fork's prairie, three men; James McGee, at Half Moon prairie, four men; Smith & Wilson, on Fork's creek, four men; Giesey & Drissler, on Trap creek, four men; Forney Soule's camp, on the south fork of the Willapa, fifteen men; Wm. Ellis, on the south fork, three men; Ellis & Weatherford, on the south fork, three men; Henry Ellis, on the south fork, seven or eight men; Hastings & Brown, on the south fork, three men; McDonald's camp, on Mill creek, four men. The output of logs will not be so large this as that of last year. The rain, which, in the Willapa valley, was continuous on Saturday and Sunday night and on Monday afternoon and night last, has raised the creeks and river considerably, and some think early rains will cause till loggers to run their logs earlier this fall than usual.

There are several "enable women" in Tillamook - among them Miss Maggie Fearnside, who superintends her father's home, clerks in his store, and is his bookkeeper. Her worth has just been recognized in her appointment as postmaster to succeed Mr. Chas. Miller, recently resigned. Another woman runs a store, another helps conduct a hotel, another is part proprietor of the toll road over the mountains, and several are engaged in school teaching. At least one young woman, Miss Lizzie Hoxie, has taken up a land claim near the bay, has a cabin erected, and will soon secure a title to it - New Northwest.
