PANAMA SHIP RAILWAY. CAPT. CORTHILL, of the American association for the advancement of science, at a late session of that society, said, in the course of an address on the commercial advantages that would come to the United States through the construction of a canal across the Isthmus of Panama: "The free in terchange of commerce is seriously hampered by this inter-oceanic problem. The great expense of trans-shipment excludes the expensive use of ordinary railroads Cereals of the Pacific, and other products, agricultural and manufactured, traverse long and expensive routes to market. Our manufacturers who turn out over powers. five billion dollars annually-exporting only 2 per cent.-cannot participate in the two billions worth of trade in the far Pacific countries. There are three routes: Panama, Nicaragua, Tehuantepec. Assuming the practicability of the former, its advantages are evidenced by the fact that it is nearer the axial line of production passing through Hong Kong, San Francisco, New York and Liverpool, and its nautical conditions are much more favorable. The true scientific method is that which transfers ships from ocean to ocean most promptly and economically. This method is a ship railway. 


