Exposing Mesmerism

A coterie of Chicago doctors have set out to prove that mesmerism is a fraud, and, according to the Herald, are now giving expose exhibitions of all tricks common to the stage exhi-bitions of the so-called professors, at

the office of one of their number. At the appointed hour a reporter went to the office and found several physicians present and a half a dozen "horses" standing around the room. "Horses" in professional parlance are no more nor less than the subjects operated upon by mesmerists before the public. "I want to prove," said Dr. J. B. Armstrong, in opening the entertainment, "that so-called mesmerism is nothing but the education of the mind to endure pain without giving external evidence of it, and, after close investigation of the subject the present physicians and myself, have satisfied ourselves that the professors of mesmerism who travel through the country giving exhibithrough the country giving exhibitions of their influence over other
people, are one and all frauds."

At the close of these remarks the
"horses" were called out into the
center of the room and, one of them
acting as a professor of mesmerism,

they went through the tests usually given by traveling mesmerists. Fred Warner, A. E. Brown, William Murdock, William Miller and R. F. Briggs were the subjects, and as they had each traveled through the country with some of the most noted mes-merists of the day the entertainment they gave was interesting. Dr. Gray sewed the subjects' ears through and through with a heavy surgeon's needle, William Murdock swallowed two ounces of cavenne pepper with-out a grimace, William Mills went into a cataleptic fit, and while in that condition his body was stretched on two chairs placed beneath his head and heels, and a man weighing 212 pounds sat on his stomach without settling his body one iota; Fred Warner executed a song and dance while he appeared to be asleep, and other tricks such as are usually given on the stage were shown up. One of the "horses" who was lately travel-ing with one Johnson, said they had ing with one Johnson, said they had to bear the pain of the tests without flinching in order to keep their job. When they showed in a town they were scattered around in the audience, and the professor know where to find them. The pay received by the average "horse" is \$8 per week and board, and the liability of being left with salary unpaid is thrown in. To prove that any person could edu-To prove that any person could edu-cate himself or herself to bear almost any degree of pain without giving any signs of suffering, Dr. E. S. Curtis, who had been practicing about three weeks, allowed Dr. Gray to pierce his weeks, allowed Dr. Gray to pierce his arm repeatedly with a large needle, sowing it completely through. The doctor gave no evidence that he suf-fered, but calmly conversed while it was being done. While undergoing the tests the "horses" were under no influence whatever.
