NEW YORK and Philadelphia are worrying over "the alarming practices of the degrading Chinese." New York and Philadelphia pooh poohed at our "silly Pacific coast prejudices" a few years ago, and now having learned by experience they talk worse about it than any of the "silly Pacific coast people."

THE London liberals have dug a mine to be exploded under the Tories, in pursuance of agitation on behalf of overworked railway servants. The victim of the coming attack is the Right Hon. William Henry Smith, secretary of war in the present Tory government, who was immortalized some years ago as Sir Joseph of Gilbert and Sullivan's "Pinafore."

THE rapid growth of the Knights of Labor in the United States and Canada is brought prominently into notice by published reports of the general assembly, now convening at Hamilton, Ont., and by the recent success of the Knights in electing the mayor of Newark, Conn., against formidable opposition.

THE Canada convention was opened with an address from General Master Workman Powderly, in which he claimed 4,000 assemblies of Knights, embracing 200,000 members, nearly all the growth of the past seven years. He said that in 1878 the order was unknown to the world, and belonged to a few. To-day it is known and respected everywhere, and belongs to every man and woman who toils for a livelihood, and every slave of the earth who irks for freedom from the tyranny of aggregated capital.

In the last issue to hand of this print the following paragraph occurs: "There has just been an interesting discovery in Paraguay of a tribe of Indians furnished with tails. 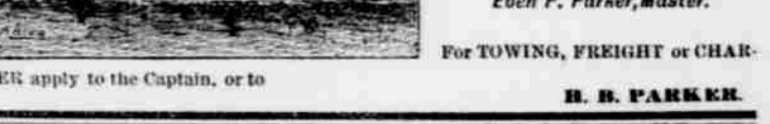
