Sherman's Poculiarities,

Gen. Sherman's habits during his campaign were of the simplest. He went to bed very late and got up carly, and thus prevented the enemy from catching him napping. The presumption is that he played cards at night, as he was always trying to machre the Confederates. Long before were in the saddle, as he used his saddle for a piltow, following the illustrious example of Gen. Pope, who habitually had his headquarters in the same place. Gen. Sherman always gave orders to arouse him at any hope of the night if reports came in the reveille sounded his headquarters r of the night if reports came in. He was more anxious to see the reports than he was to see the reporters. During the Atlanta campaign he set the example to his troops of discarding tents, which made him in-They thought Sherman was too fly altogether. He reduced baggage to a minimum. No soldier or officer was dlowed to carry more than one minimum. On one occasion, observing that a member of his staff had an extra minimum tied to his saddle, he wrenched it off and wore it out over ism. He had only one tent, and as that was used by his cherical force, we infer that his chaplain had it all to himself. The Confederates sym-pathized with Sherman when it rained and frequently attempted to take him shame on the part of Sherman not to gratify their little whim, but he never did. It used to be said that his headquarters were in a candle-box, because when he was in light me ching order one or two small boxes, cuptied of the candles they originally conthe chailes they originally continued served to transport his papers. The soldiers called him "Old Tecump" and "Uncle Billy," the latter nickname coming into general use in the army during the "March to the Sea." At his 'headquarters the soldiers called him "Uncle" because he was the man they relied on to get them out of a tight place. For the same reason a pawn-broker is called "my uncle." A single sentry stood guard; but if the sentry happened to be a married man he was not required to procure a divorce. Nobody, whether officer or private, who wanted to speak to the general, was stopped, with the exception of Gen. Hood, or Gen. Joe Jonston, or some other Confederate. He always had encouraging words for the soldiers when he rode along, telling them what a great thing it was to lay down a leg or arm on the altar of their country. Sherman was great in war as a strategist, but he betrayed still more genius in the field of politics when he refused to accept the Repub-lican nomination for Preside cy. In that instance he betrayed genius of the loftiest order.


