THE agent at the Fort Belknap Indian reservation in northern Montana, has informed the interior department that a number of Cree Indians, refugees from the British possessions, have crossed the line into the reservation, having in their possession silverware and articles of ladies' apparel, supposed to have been captured during the Big Bear outbreak. The agent requested that these intruders be escorted across the line and forbidden to enter the United States. The matter was referred to the secretary of state, who has replied that these Indians cannot be arrested, except upon extradition by the British authorities, and that this government should not countenance any kidnapping of Indians. The interior department is at a loss to know how the dangerous refugees can be removed, under the circumstances.


