SCHOOL HYGIENE.

Measures for the Prevention of Contagions Diseases in Schools.

The Medical officers of Schools Association, which was formed in Engrules for the prevention of infections and contagious diseases in schools, which contains some valuable sug-gestions and which is important as being a formal expression of opinion on the part of medical men and sani-tarians who have made and saniland in 1884, has just issued a code of tarians who have specially investigated the subject of school hygiene. The first section relating to general hy-giene gives the usual advice with regard to house-drainage, dust-bins, etc., and advises that the medical officer of the school shall inspect the premises at least once a month and that he should make an annual return of the sickness in the school to the governing body.

With regard to the length of quar-

antine that should be required if a pupil has been exposed to an infec-tious disease, it is stated that this depends chiefly upon whether the school has or has not that very valuable safeguard—a disinfecting appar-atus, which apparatus should be large enough to hold a full-sized mattress. If the school possess such an apparatus, then the quarantine should be a day or two more than the longest known period of incubation of the disease in question; if not, the period should be longer still, as there is no definite time when the clothing is certain to be free from infection.

Disinfection at home, it is urged, should not be relied on, but immediately on the pupil's return to school he should be washed with carbolic acid soap (ten per cent.) from head to foot in a hot bath, and that clothes books and everything brought back by him should be completely disin-

fected. With regard to the question, "When may a pupil who has had an infectious disease go home or rejoin the school?" the following are recommended as safe rules, viz. :

Scarlet fever-in not less than six weeks from the date of the rash, if desquamation have completely ceased and there be no appearance of sore throat.

Measles—in not less than three

weeks from the date of the rash, if all desquamation and cough have ceased. German measles (Rothein, or epi

demic roscola) - in two or three weeks, the exact time depending upon the nature of the attack. Small-pox and chicken-pox-when every scab has fallen off.

Mumps—in four weeks from the commencement, if all swelling have Close connections made at Ashland with stages of the California & Oregon Stage Co.

Whooping-cough-after six weeks from the commencement of the whooping, provided the characteristic spasmodic cough and the whooping have ceased; or earlier, if all cough have completely passed away.

Diphtheria—in not less than three weeks, when convalescence is com-


