No section of the state is more directly interested than Clatsop county in the selection of a senator by the legislature which meets at Salem next Monday. We want a free river and we want a man in Washington with Senator Dolph with knowledge, experience and ability, a soul above sectional prejudice, and readiness to aid in the forwarding of necessary improvements.

It is cheaper to ship grain by water than by rail, and even if the Northern Pacific were completed across the Cascades to Puget Sound, proper development of the magnificent waterway of the Columbia would send all the grain this way. The work of improving the bar of the Columbia has begun: sufficient appropriation is needed to enable the work to be resumed next spring and continue uninterrupted through the summer.

The New York Times says of the Panama canal company: "In May last the company's obligations were about \$153,000,000, which had yielded about \$111,000,000 for use, and nearly all of this had been spent. The recent call upon stockholders, with the proceeds of lottery bonds, if they should be issued, would raise the total of the liabilities to nearly \$288,000,000. De Lesseps now admits that the canal will cost twice as much as the Suez canal did, but the cost of that canal was less than \$100,000,000, and even at this stage of the work on the Panama isthmus he proposes to multiply that sum by three. To encourage shareholders, he assures them that the earnings of the Panama canal will be three times as great as those of the canal at Suez. This assurance shows how desperate the condition of the Panama company has become. The Economiste Francais does not hesitate to warn its country-

men that the whole concern is on the verge of probable bankruptcy, and when the collapse does come it will be the most terrible of the nineteenth century."

REPRESENTATIVES of the Knights of Labor allege that the public press, in assigning reasons for the Democratic victory in New York, has quite overlooked the importance of that organization as a factor in the results. One of its officers, who is also in the government service, and who spent some days in New York and Brooklyn in the interest of the organization, says its members there voted almost unanimously for Hill, and claim that success was due to their efforts. Hill's answers to certain questions about the labor question pleased them better than Davenport's did.

THE Sound papers gleefully reprint a recent Oregonian editorial in which it was asserted that Puget sound was Portland's only shipping competitor. The Tacoma Ledger says: "If Portland is our only competitor we have nothing to fear." But Portland is not your only "real competitor" at all. The "real competitor" is the city that is the only seaport of Oregon—Astoria, and don't let the fact escape your memory.

UNION county is going to ask the legislature next week to appropriate \$15,000 for a wagon road from Baker City to the Pine Creek mining district. Portland favors the idea, as it claims the trade will thus be diverted from Omaha to the Willamette.
