COUNTY BOUNDARIES.

THE ASTORIAN says "The Nehalem settlers are moving in the matter of a petition to the legislature praying that the present boundary lines between Clatsop and Columbia counties be moved east three miles." The only "settler" who is moving to any extent in the matter is a party by the name of Cameron, and he assigns as a reason that the taxes are too high in Columbia county, although as he is not a tax payer, this cannot affect him.

Prior to the legislature of '85, the east boundary line of Clatsop county crossed West's slough just at Wood's landing, in sec. 8, T. 7, two miles due east of Westport, though for all practical purposes the county line was supposed to be at Westport as all east of that was assessed in Columbia county.
