THE OREGONIAN.

The Oregonian was thirty-five years old yesterday. The Sunday Oregonian celebrates its fourth anniversary to-day. To say that the Oregonian is the leading newspaper of the northwest is but to say what every one concedes to be the fact.

People care less for newspaper opinions than most newspaper men imagine. Of course a man in or out of a newspaper office that has no opinion is a fool; a man that is afraid to express his opinion is a coward, but what we mean is a vast majority of newspaper readers care less for the editor's opinion than for the exact statement of the facts themselves.

In coloring the statement of facts to suit the beliefs, hopes or wishes of the editor, the journal in question loses prestige and standing, for people readily see and judge how much credence to give what they see in a newspaper.
