The number of paupers in the United Kingdom under relief amounts to 1,000,000, or rather less than onethirtieth of the population, and the cost of their maintenance is £10,-000,000 sterling annually. In regard to the postoffice, the letters posted annually in the world are 5,200,000,000; of this total 1,500,-000,000, or 34 per cent., are in the British empire. Respecting education, there are 5,250,000 pupils at schools in the United Kingdom, 860,000 in Canada, 611,000 in Australia, and 2,200,000 in India, making a total of 8,921,000 pupils in the British empire.

It is still an open question whether Great Britain is strengthened by her vast colonial possessions. There are less than forty million Anglo Saxons in the British empire, but these are the governing power in an empire of 315,-000,000. The English-speaking people of the world now considerably exceed a hundred millions. The fifty-five millions of inhabitants in the United States for the most part speak English; the remainder to round out the hundred millions are found in the British colonies. Four great empires have to-day, practically, possession of the globe. They are Great Britain, the United States, Cigars, Tobacce and Cigarettes Russia and China. The most aggressive people on the globe today are the Anglo-Saxons, or in a broader sense, those who speak

the people who are ransacking the globe for new possessions. The dominant race on the earth will be the one which has this language at command, with the instincts of the Anglo-Saxon.
