haps to have shown that most men

die before their time.

clinging to it. Religious enthusiasm

may regard it as a passage the

sooner crossed the better to a higher

form of existence; and inability to

perform its duties or incapacity for

its enjoyments may lead unfortunate

natures to throw it blindly away; but

tion, and energies evenly de-
