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Good Stories of Georgia Judges.

Judge William H. Underwood was at Oglethorpe Court when the

incumbent, after a long and heated argument, closed by saying:

"He was not very fastidious about it, nohow." Judge Underwood

promptly replied: "I now understand the definition of that misun-

derstood word, fastidiousness, which I now learn means to hold fast and for a long te-dious time."

On one occasion Judge Dooly stopped with Charter Campbell, of Madison. When his bill was presented next morning, he said:

"Well, Mr. Campbell, do you really think I owe you \$3.00 for the entertain-

ment of me and my horse Cherokee?" "Oh, yes, judge; it is a fair and usual charge."

"Well, Mr. Campbell, if the poet had stopped with you, instead of saying: 'Man wants but little here below, nor wants but little long,' he might have said: 'If man has but little here below, and stops with you, he will not have that little long.'"

Judge Thomas, of Elbert, in which county Judge Underwood, said the people of that county would like to see him there, and thought he could make a pleasant visit to the old place. "Yes," said the judge, "there is an honest stupidity about the people of Elbert which is amusing, and which I rather like."

Some citizen of the county who took the remark of the judge as offensive, meeting him afterward, rebukingly said he ought to take it back. "Well," said the judge, "I will take back part of it, and since the county voted for Buchanan, I will withdraw the word 'honest.'"

Judge Underwood was for a long time accused of being an old Federalist of the John Adams school, which was a term of reproach in Georgia. Having been taunted by a politician for being a Federalist, who said to him: "You have always been but two parties in the country, and we class you with the Federalists, for all know that is your place."

"Yes," said the judge, "there have always been two parties, Federalists and fools, and I have never heard you accused of belonging to the Federalists."

In the long ago, in the 30's, there was a judge who presided in the western circuit whose birthplace was in one of the New England States. He was a decided Union man, and when the Nullifiers became so violent that some northern men shrank from acknowledging their nativity, meeting one too firm to deny it, Judge Tracy greeted him heartily because he was not ashamed of his birthplace, and said: "That is bold and honest. If you come from h— bring a pocketful of brimstone with you."

A Georgia judge said "that the maxim that innocence was to be presumed until guilt was proved, when an Irishman was accused of a murder and battery, then guilt was to be presumed."

A lawyer addressing a jury on a case proved by strong circumstantial evidence, repeated often that "ninety-nine guilty men should escape rather than that one innocent man should suffer."

The judge, in charging the jury, told them "the ninety-nine guilty had long since escaped."—Savannah News.
