There are more than 1,000,000 ex-soldiers still living.

It costs a million and a half more to run the New York state government now than it did five years ago.

JAY GOULD is now the richest man in America. He is estimated at \$125,000,000 and is only forty-nine years old.

The total number of business failures in the United States during 1885 was 10,637, with liabilities of \$226,000,000.

SMITH, the Vermontor who wants to succeed Edmunds as senator, is incautiously heralded as the richest man in the state.

The ex-king regent of Portugal left his German-American widow, a Boston-born woman, by the way, a fortune of \$1,000,000.
