EADS' SHIP RAILWAY.

"The bill," he said, "proposes that a loaded vessel, weighing, with her load, 4,000 tons, shall be carried across the Isthmus of Tehuantepec. A vessel of 4,000 tons weight would be one of not over 2,000 tons carrying capacity or tonnage. Does congress propose to be satisfied with such a test, or consider that a vessel of 2,000 tons burden will solve the great prob-lem of interoceanic transit between the Atlantic and the Pacific?
