An investigation by Mr. W. F. Smith, an American chemist, indicates that good cider never contains ss than three and one-half per cent of alcohol, and should have about five per cent. The acetic acid in genuine eider vinegar may fall below four per cent, but a good article should contain five per cent, and from five and one-half to seven per cent when prepared from the better grades of eider.

PAPER PIANOS, -An interesting experiment has been made in Germany with compressed paper-ca-pable of high polish-as a material for piano-cases. The tone of the instrument is reported to be not loud but very sweet; and, unlike the short broken note of the ordinary piano, the sound is soft, full and slightly continuous, resembling somewhat that of the organ. This modification of tone is ascribed to the evenness of texture of the compressed

MINUTE WORK .- Some remarkable representations of a boquet were by Henry Dalton, the late English microscopist. Each of them was prepared on glass, from the scales and hair of Brazilian butterflies, and to the naked eye looked like small shot, but under a powerful instrument showed eighty-two distinct flowers of various shades and colors. There are some fifty of these microscope slides in this country, it is said, and they are held so valuable that money can scarcely purchase them.

FLORA AND FAUNA OF BURMAH .-The natural history of Burmah, to which the war has attracted attention, is in many respects peculiar and interesting. The flora is richer in color than in most tropical regions, and abounds in orchids and fragrant creeping plants. The moon-creeper is a remarkable vine, bearing flowers that open only on moon-lit nights. Insects are numerous, including voracious mosquitoes and many gor-geous butterflies. Crocodiles and catfish of great size abound in the rivers. Small deer and jungle fowl are the principal game. The cobra, attaining a length of six feet and more, is the most dangerous reptile.

A STORM'S JOURNEY .- The first storm ever followed day by day from the Pacific to Europe has been de-scribed to the Royal Meteorological Society of London by Mr. Harry Harries. It originated as a typhoon near the Philippine Islands on September 27, passing over Japan and the Aleutian Islands, and entering the United States on October 10. Crossing the Rocky Mountains, it proceeded through the northern states and Canada to Labrador and Davis Strait. Encountering two other disturbances in its passage of the Atlantic, it reached the French coast on October 27, causing extensive destruction, and on November in the Baltic, it quietly dispersed, after accomplishing over 16,000 miles in 36 days.


