SOME BILLS INTRODUCED
In The Oregon State Senate On The 11th inst.

No. 1 by Weatherford—To regulate foreign corporations doing business in this state, and to describe the powers and duties of said corporations. It provides that foreign corporations must abide by our state laws, and not bring suits in the United States courts instead of the state courts.

No. 2, by Veatch—To regulate the amount of attorneys' fees on written contracts and collections.

No. 2, by Veatch—An act to incorporate the town of Cottage Grove.

No. 4, by Irvin—To reduce legal interest to 6 and 8 per cent, 8 per cent to be allowed by contract, and to repeal existing laws in conflict therewith.

No. 5, by Stanley—To regulate the practice of medicine. The bill provides for a state board of medical examiners.

No. 6, by Hare—Amending section 347, title 4, chapter 4, of the miscellaneous laws, to read: "No action may be maintained against any of the counties in this state, except on written contract made by such county corporation, and not otherwise, but an action may be maintained against other corporations." The idea of the amendment is that if a person be damaged by falling through a county bridge in bad repair or be otherwise injured through public negligence, he shall have to settle any claim for damages with the county commissioners and not in the courts.

No. 7, by Dawson—To prevent bulls from running at large.

No. 8, by Chamberlin—To create a state board of charities. This bill is identical with that introduced in the house by McLean.

No. 9, by Wager—To regulate the foreclosure of mortgages and the collection of taxes thereon. The bill provides that the mortgagee shall be responsible for the taxes until the taxes are delinquent, when the mortgagor shall be liable, and if the mortgagor pay, the taxes so paid shall be considered a partial payment of his debt to the mortgagee, whether indorsed on the mortgage or not; and should the note fall into the hands of innocent purchasers such payment of taxes by the mortgagor shall still be held to be part payment of the indebtedness. It also provides that all agreements of mortgagors to pay taxes shall be null and void, and no suit to foreclose a mortgage in any court in this state shall be maintained until the taxes shall have been paid.

No. 10, by Lee—Reimbursing Douglas, Washington, Yamhill, Clackamas, Umatilla and Linn counties for delinquent taxes for 1883 and 1884, assessed on mortgages, which taxes were paid into the state treasury and not collected by the counties.

No. 11, by Lee—Reducing the fees of the clerk of the supreme court.

No. 12, by Lee—Providing for the purchase of land near Salem and for the erection of a brick building for deaf mutes, at a cost not to exceed \$20,000.

No. 14, by Barin—To provide for the collection of road taxes and the election of road supervisors.

No. 15, by Simon—Authorizing the construction of a bridge across the Willamette river from Portland to East Portland. This is the railroad bridge petitioned for. The petition of 1,124 citizens who petitioned for the bridge, was introduced.

No. 16, by Cartwright—To amend the Prineville charter.

No. 17, by Shupe—Provides for health officers at Gardiner and Coos bay.

No. 18, by Gray—Declaring the ocean beach of the state a public highway, so that persons cannot fence it up to prevent the use of it for a public highway.

No. 19, by Irvin—To simplify practice in justices courts.

No. 20, by Barin—To prevent frauds in procuring certificates of registration of cattle and to punish any person giving a false certificate of the pedigree of any horse, cow, swine, etc., on penalty of a fine of \$500 or imprisonment in the penitentiary.

No. 21, by Chandler—Making it unlawful for any person to sell any minor under 18 years of age

cigars, tobacco, cigarettes or firearms.

A Reapportionment Bill
A reapportionment bill, made on the basis of population, as shown by the last June election and assumed to be 243,418, divides the state into senatorial and representative districts, on the basis of 8,114 population for the former and 4,057 for the latter, introduced in the legislature on the 11th. It provides for representation as follows:
Senators—Coos and Curry counties 1, Benton 1, Polk 1, Yamhill 1, Washington 1, Clatsop 1, Columbia and Tillamook 1, Multnomah 5, Clackamas 1, Marion 2, Linn 2, Lane 1, Douglas 1, Josephine 1, Jackson 1, Klamath and Lake 1, Crook 1, Gilliam 1, Wasco 1, Umatilla 1, Morrow 1, Union 2, Baker 1 and Grant 1.
The apportionment of representatives is as follows: Coos and Curry 2, Benton 2, Polk 2, Yamhill 3, Washington 3, Clatsop 2, Columbia and Tillamook 1, Multnomah 10, Clackamas 3, Marion 4, Linn 3, Lane 3, Josephine 1, Jackson 2, Klamath and Lake 1, Crook 1, Gilliam 1, Wasco 2, Umatilla 3, Morrow 1, Union 3, Baker 2 and Grant 2.
