In the U. S. Senate.  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—Dolph, from the committee on coast defenses, reported as an amendment to be offered, an item appropriating \$5,000,000 for the construction of fortifications and other works of defense. Ordered printed.  
On motion of Ingalls the senate bill to amend section 3,749 of the revised statutes, in regard to renting and selling government property was taken up.  
The senate at 1:15 o'clock resumed consideration of the interstate commerce bill and was addressed by Call. He declared his concurrence in the great objects of public policy which were sought to be carried into effect by the original bill by the conference report.

Ingalls expressed a hope that Callum would not insist on a vote today. The action of the senate has developed in the press and other organs of public opinion a feeling of intense interest, which he regarded as profitable to those engaged in the consideration of the subject.  
Call referred to the fact stated in the work of the pool that the capitalization of the railroads in this country exceeds their cost three billion dollars. The rates charged for transportation pay the interest and dividends, and it is a fictitious and pretended capital. They are now paying an annual tax on \$300,000,000 fictitious capital. He could see nothing in that if it was permitted to continue but ruin to this republic. No regulation of an inter-state nature should be made that permitted such an enormous annual tax. Did the conference report propose to remedy this evil? It did not. On the contrary, it implicitly licensed it by failing to provide any remedy. The reasonable rates sought to be established by the bills should be reasonable rates calculated on the amounts actually invested in the construction and operation of railroads. If that is not to be done the bill will be futile. He was in favor of going much farther than the bill went. He would, however, vote, pending the bill, but regarded it as no remedy for the existing evils, and no triumph for those who desire to see inter-state commerce regulated.  
Brown made argument in opposition to the bill. It is likely the vote will be taken to-morrow. The senate in executive session considered at length the extradition treaty with Great Britain. The debate lasted nearly two hours and touched upon every phase of our relations with England, social and commercial. The dynamite question, although in no way directly involved, was a bone of contention and aroused great feeling. No action was taken on the treaty.

**Death of Iddesleigh.**  
LONDON, Jan. 12.—Lord Iddesleigh died suddenly this afternoon. He was attacked by illness while descending the stairs of Lord Salisbury's residence and died twenty minutes later of syncope. He has been troubled with heart disease for some years.

**Nevada's Senator.**  
CARSON, Nev., Jan. 12.—William M. Stewart was to-day chosen United States senator by the legislature, receiving 46 out of 69 votes. George W. Cassidy received a complimentary vote from the Democrats.

**An Appeal for an Open Waterway.**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11.—In the senate to-day Senator Dolph secured the floor and submitted lengthy and forcible remarks on his resolution looking to the establishment of a boat railway at The Dalles. After referring to the size of the Columbia, the commerce thereon, the area drained thereby, the population along its tributaries, and the great need of an unobstructed river, he spoke of the works necessary to remove such obstructions. He said the improvement at The Dalles should have been commenced at the same time as that at the Cascades. He regarded a boat railway, based on the reports of the engineer, as not visionary but entirely practicable. Never before in the history of the government has there been such an auspicious time for beginning such an experiment, if this can be denominated an experiment. The country is at peace, is prosperous and the treasury is overflowing with a hoarded surplus. He had no apology to make for the earnestness and persistency with which he has ever pressed upon the attention of the senate and the commerce committee the importance of improving the rivers and harbors of the northwest. He characterized the question of an unobstructed river as the all-absorbing one with the people living in the country tributary to the Columbia. They are interested in coast defenses, are not indifferent to the subject of tariff and finance, but the one transcending all others—over that of party politics—is the subject of an unobstructed river. In that is involved the question of cheap transportation, which, when secured, means assured and permanent prosperity.  
Action on the resolution by the senate was not asked, as the Oregon senators have concluded to seek to secure an appropriation for the boat railway in the river and harbor bill, subject to the approval of plans by the secretary of war.
