Congressional.
SENATE.
WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 2.—
The senate had a request from the
house of representatives for an en-
grossed copy of the last bill to for-
feit certain lands of the Northern
Pacific. Ordered complied with.
After some discussion on con-
stitutionality of the measure, the
senate passed a special appropriation
for \$10,000 for the distribution
of seeds for the drought
stricken section of Texas.
The senate began at 1 o'clock
in the afternoon an important
debate based on the statement by
Allison as to the probable receipts
and expenditures of the govern-
ment for the next fiscal year. Al-
lison showed by figures a very
small surplus, if any.
Plant took up the question of
coast defenses, and argued that
congress would be derelict in a
most imperative duty if it ad-
journed without making liberal
appropriations for fortifications,
guns and ships.
WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—The
senate to-day passed the sundry
civil appropriation bills.

HOUSE.
The house passed a bill approp-
riating \$100,000 for a soldiers' home
west of the Rocky moun-
tains. In the course of the debate
Anderson, of Ohio, said the people
of California owned 900 acres of
land upon which was already es-
tablished a state home. The
proposition is made by California
that if the government will make
the appropriation of \$100,000 for
the home they will cede the whole
property to the government. Sen-
ator Williams will push the bill in
the senate.
The house discussed the pleuro-
pneumonia bill, but took no action
upon it.
The estimates of the cost of the
Niagara canal vary from \$75,
000,000 to \$100,000,000. It is
800 miles north of the Panama canal
and 172 miles long, 119 miles
rivers.

The public debt of Canada has
increased \$75 a minute during
the whole of Sir John McDonald's
administration, allowing ten work-
ing hours a day and twenty s-
working days in the month.—*Tor-
ontor Globe.*

When the census was taken, six
years ago, St. Paul had 45,000 in-
habitants. It claims 150,000 to-
day, and 300,000 for the two
towns of St. Paul and Minneapolis
which some day will meet each
other.

board yesterday, reported to the
senate a bill with favorable recom-
mendation and an emphatic report
signed by eight of the nine sena-
tors on the committee, four Re-
publicans and four Democrats, ap-
propriating \$500,000 for a final
survey and commencement of con-
struction of a boat railway at the
Dalles. The following senators

Carolina, Vest of Missouri, Gibson
of Louisiana and Call of Florida.
