A War Panic Predicted.
New York, Feb. 3.—The Times special from London says: Although the scare yesterday was the worst since rumors began to circulate, it is not comparable probable with the panic in store for next week, when the German reserves in seven western divisions, numbering 72,000 men, will join their colors. It was not generally known that a movement was so imminent, and it is believed it will create an excitable impression in France. Despite all pacific assurance from Paris, I have a statement confirming Saturday's report that arms, men and munitions of war are being turned eastward. This renders more substantial floating suspicions that Boulanger is getting ready a coup of his own. Belief in war has become such a universal thing that one of the evening papers has an editorial saying there will be peace, and everybody talks about the article as a singular thing.

Paris now, for the first time, really believes that war is inevitable, and private letters from Berlin and Hanover report general preparations among army officers to provide for the safety of their families early in the spring.

Montana cattlemen are greatly alarmed for the future, owing to the overstocking of the ranges. Last year witnessed a heavy influx of cattle brought there to winter. Large herds were brought over the parched trail from the Rio Grande, and in their famished condition placed on ranges already so fully stocked that only a phenomenally mild winter could prevent heavy losses. To make matters worse the calf crop was unusually large. Up to Christmas the weather was favorable and all was well, but since then the temperature ranging as low as 40 below and blinding storms, before which cattle drift in spite of the cowboys' efforts, reduce the cattle in flesh and so weaken them as to make heavy losses inevitable if the cold weather continues.

A Frenchman by the name of Leroy, living in the woods at Eastis, Me., recently inherited \$45,000 by the death of his grandfather in France. Leroy had married an Indian woman, and on hearing of the fortune awaiting him in France, left his wife, made the journey there and back again, a sister of his coming with him. He brought his wife a present of a gold watch and chain and went back to his home in the woods to live as usual.

In London not long since, a saintly individual tried to offer up prayer at a meeting of his creditors. Among the latter was a rough Scotchman, who, amazed at the coolness of the act, shouted, "Sit down, ye rascally hypocrite! If you say another word to the Almighty in my presence, dom me if I dinna kick ye," etc. The creditors roared, the petitioner sat down, and the business of the meeting proceeded.

There are 25,810 doctors in Great Britain, or one for every 1,350 inhabitants. In France the proportion is one for 1,400; in Austria, Germany and Norway, one for every 1,500; in the United States, one for every 600, while in Russia there is only one for 6,226.

Fighting In Africa.
Paris, Feb. 3.—The Republic Francaise published a dispatch from Suez, which states that in the battles between the Abyssinians and the Italians near Massowah, January 28, the Abyssinians captured all the guns possessed by the Italians. It also says that of 480 Italians in the fight not more than fifty escaped. The dispatch adds that the Italians evacuated all the advanced positions. The Abyssinians have already attacked and carried the first line of Italian entrenchments around Massowah. It is doubtful whether the Italians will be able to hold Massowah until the arrival of reinforcements.

The Dalles Sun learns that the surveyors of the Northern Pacific railroad will take the field as early as possible in the spring for the purpose of running a line down the Columbia river on the Washington territory side, from Wallula to a point opposite the Willamette river.
