**THE STATE LEGISLATURE.**

**SENATE.**

**AFTERNOON SESSION.**

SALEM, Feb. 7.—The senate was called to order by President Carson. Roll called. Reading of journal dispensed with.

**THIRD READING SENATE BILLS.**

Simon, the O. R. & N. railroad lease, passed. Ayes 26, noes 3. Those voting no were Cauthorne, Veatch and Weatherford.

Simon, amending the foreign incorporation law relating to leases by foreign corporations. Passed.

A message from the governor was received appointing T. J. Hendricks and C. C. Beekman regents of the state university. The senate confirmed the nominations.

The bill redistricting and re-appportioning the state, read twice and ordered printed, and made special order for Thursday at 2 o'clock.

Barin, to prevent the spread of contagious animal diseases. Referred to a special committee.

Cartwright, creating a sheep inspector for each county for contagious diseases. Passed.

Miller, to incorporate Grant's Pass. Passed.

Simon, increasing the salaries of the supreme judges, pending which senate adjourned.

**HOUSE.**

**AFTERNOON SESSION.**

Roll was called; journal read and approved.

A resolution from the city council of Walla Walla relating to the improvement of the Columbia river was read and placed on file.

Maxwell, for a committee to visit the blind school. Adopted.

Hale, instructing the secretary of state to furnish chains for closing the entrance of the house to keep lobbyists out. Adopted.

**FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS.**

Harrington, relating to foreign corporations doing business in the state.

Pomeroy, to provide for local aid in building the Columbia and Tillamook wagon road.

Pomeroy, to provide commissioners for Columbia county. Read second time and referred to committee on counties.

Simon, O. R. & N. lease bill.

Simon, defining the duties and liabilities of corporations. A motion to suspend the rules and read second time was lost.

R. A. Miller, relating to road supervisors.

Crook, permitting gates on county roads under certain conditions.

Thompson, amending the dairy law.

Noyer, for the relief of Geo. Clark for services in the construction of the fish ladder.

**SECOND READING.**

To regulate the fees of the county clerk of Clatsop. Engrossed.

**SECOND READING SENATE BILLS.**

Amending the McMinville charter.

For the recovery of real and personal property escheated to the state.

O. R. & N. lease bill made a special order for Wednesday at 2 P. M. Motion to suspend the rules and read S. B. 55, second time, was lost.

**THIRD READING HOUSE BILLS.**

Relating to appeals. Indefinitely postponed.

To legalize certain county roads. Indefinitely postponed.

To amend the act for securing liens for mechanics, laborers, material men, et al. Passed.

For the selection and sale of state lands remaining unsold. Passed.

The motion to take the motion to reconsider the Portland water bill from the table, was lost, 21 to 21.

Munger indigent witness bill providing for the immediate taking of testimony, failed to pass.

Amending the act creating roads of the public, and creating roads of public easement, and requiring the petitioners to file a bond for damages. Passed.

Noyer's road law was referred to committee of the whole. House adjourned.

**Evening Session.**  
**HOUSE BILLS PASSED.**  
Goodwill, for the relief of certain firemen of Portland.

Henry, to allow a school district in Lion county to build a school house.

Harrington, abolishing county clerk of Multnomah county and creating the office of clerk of the circuit court. Clerk of county court and recorder of deeds and conveyances.

Wilcox, amending the Arlington charter.

Wilcox, fixing the time for holding circuit court in the Seventh district.

Benjamin, fixing the time for holding circuit court in the Second district.

Bowditch, fixing the time for holding circuit court in the First district. Adjourned.

**A Probable Resolution of Inquiry.**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—A statement is current in railroad circles in Philadelphia that before the close of the session there will be introduced in the house of representatives a resolution calling on the Union Pacific railroad to show by what authority of law the Oregon Short Line was constructed and by what authority the bonds of said road were guaranteed by the Union Pacific. The statement is made by certain government officials that since the construction of the Oregon Short Line, said road has been operated at a loss of \$600,000 a year; that so much of the Union Pacific receipts as may be necessary, are applied to make up this deficiency, and thereby lessening the values of Union Pacific securities. The interest that the government holds in the road is the basis of the alleged inquiry. —Oregonian Special.
