WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.—The senate committee on commerce today considered the claim of Oregon in connection with the river and harbor bill. The different items were taken up in order and passed upon. It is possible that a final revision, such as is usually made by committees, will slightly change the results reached, but this is doubtful. Following, which may be considered unofficial, as they have not been formally submitted to the senate, are the increases made over the house appropriations.
Mouth of the Columbia, from \$125,000 to \$300,000.
Cascades, from \$100,000 to \$150,000.
Yaquina, from \$50,000 to \$80,000.
Lower Willamette and Columbia rivers, from \$35,000 to \$80,000.
It will be seen that the increase, including fifteen thousand for a boat railway, is three hundred and fifteen thousand over the house bill. The total for Oregon rivers and harbors, as passed by the house, was three hundred and sixty-five thousand. Mr. Dolph's efforts to secure large appropriations were supplemented by those of two or three senators who have visited Oregon. Senator Gofman was the most outspoken of non-resident senators for liberal appropriations. The exceptionally large increase for the mouth of the Columbia was secured largely through his influence. He holds that by far the largest single appropriation should be applied at this point.
When the item for a boat railway at The Dalles was reached, at Dolph's suggestion, Mitchell was invited to appear before the committee and state his views on the measure. After he withdrew, the committee authorized the Oregon senators to prepare such an amendment as they desired to submit for a survey of the Dalles and for an appropriation therefor of \$15,000, and promised that it should be incorporated in the bill. The total amount appropriated last session for Oregon rivers was \$598,750.—Oregonian Special.

Illinois has the largest mileage, 9,579, and Rhode Island the smallest, 210. The total mileage in the United States is 137,500.
