THE LEGISLATURE'S LAST DAY.
SENATE.
SALEM, Feb. 18.—H. B. 167, Paulsen, for the election in each county at the next election of two county commissioners, one for two and the other for four years, they to draw lots for the long term; and that every two years thereafter one commissioner be elected; passed.
H. B. 56, that the sheriffs of Yamhill, Grant, Benton, Josephine, Coos, Curry, Douglas and Clatsop counties be allowed 2 per cent. for collecting taxes; passed.
H. B. 210, Kruse, appropriating \$1,500 to insure the pilot schooner *Gov. Moody* and empowering the board of pilot commissioners to appoint what pilots they deem necessary; passed.
H. C. R. 26, that members be not held responsible by their constituents on their return home; laid on the table.
H. B. 51, Roberts, changing the name of the town of Argyle to Bandion; passed.
H. B. 190, Benjamin, for an agricultural association in each county of the state; passed.
H. B. 156, Vanderpool, that all moneys appropriated for road purposes be expended on the roads for which appropriated; passed.
H. B. 266, Mayer, for a guide board at forks and crossings of each county road; passed.
The senate concurred in the house joint resolution that a joint convention be held to-night to elect three fish commissioners. The president appointed Allen and Wager as senate members of the joint fish commission.
The assessment and taxation bill, after several amendments by Simon, was placed on its final passage and lost; yeas 14, noes 14, absent 2.
The committee appointed to wait on Governor Penoyer reported that the governor congratulated the senate on the faithful discharge and conclusion of its labors, and that he had nothing further to offer.
President Carson in a few well timed remarks, thanked the senators for the many courtesies extended to him during the session. Adjourned sine die.

HOUSE.
The house concurred in the senate resolution providing for a joint committee to visit Astoria to investigate the fisheries question. The chair appointed Maxwell, Pomeroy and Bilyeu.
The house concurred in the senate joint memorial praying congress to make a wagon road around Cape Perpetua.
Siglin's bill for a dyke across Istimus slough, Coos county, passed.
To authorize the governor to secure the return to Oregon of the body of ex-Gov. Gibbs. Passed.
To provide for the construction of cattle crossings under public roads. Passed.
For the recovery by heirs of escheat property. Passed.
To authorize the Oregonian Railway Bridge company to bridge the Willamette river for use of railroads, wagon teams, for passengers, etc., and to collect toll. Passed.
Amending the act relating to directors of corporations. Passed.
To prevent fraud in obtaining certificates of registration of cattle. Passed.
Repealing the act protecting pheasants failed to pass.
Creating the office of fish commissioner, etc. Passed.
Creating a state sheep commissioner and veterinary surgeon. Failed to pass.
Providing the manner in which wire fences shall be constructed east of the Cascade mountains. Passed.
S. E.—Game law; preventing the killing of deer except for use of the flesh. Failed; 27 to 27.
Taxing foreign corporations. A motion to adopt the amendments was laid on the table, thus killing the bill.
A motion to read Watts' liquor license bill under a suspension of the rules. Failed.
A motion to take up the Portland charter bill and senate bill 183, was lost.
To require railroads to pay for live stock killed by trains or engines. Passed.

JOINT CONVENTION.
The senate appeared at 8:05, and both houses went into joint convention to elect three fish commissioners.
The roll was called with the following result: R. C. Campbell, 40; F. C. Reed, 60; J. O. Bozorth, 39; W. D. Adair, 33; E. P. Thompson, 65; Jerry Caldwell, 1; Col. Harrington, 1; Joe Simon, 1; Campbell, Reed and E. P. Thompson were declared elected.
S. B.—To amend the civil code. Passed.
A committee was appointed to wait upon Governor Penoyer and inform him that the house was about to adjourn, and ask if he had anything to offer. The governor's answer was that he had nothing to offer, but only to congratulate the members for the faithful discharge of their duty. Thanks were tendered to the officers and senate. Much taffy was exchanged by members.
The general appropriation bill was passed with the senate amendments, and the amendments concurred in.
The house returned thanks to the ministers and newspaper reporters; also to the lady clerks.
Speaker Gregg delivered a written address, which was upon motion, spread upon the minutes.
Bilyeu moved that the house adjourn sine die. Adjourned.
