Diking at Westport.
Last spring John West finished the construction of a dyke on his place 1 1/2 miles long, 5 feet high, 11 feet at base, 4 feet at top, which reclaims 300 acres of fine land. The diking was finished last spring except the flood-gates in the sloughs. The diking without the gates, of which are five in as many different sloughs, sufficed to keep out the water, and to dry the ground sufficient to permit the cattle to go over all the enclosed land during the freshets of June last, while, therefore, at such time the stock were unable to go over any portion of the land. In ordinary tides the difference between highest and lowest is about six feet, so that it required a high tide, such as a high full noontide, to cause the water to overflow the land. The Columbia river at Westport is wide enough so that the summers floods do not cause it to rise so high as further up stream, requiring less work in diking than it otherwise would do. The cost of the diking, not counting the flood gates, was about \$2.50 per rod, or \$1,400, and the five flood gates \$650, and in the aggregate \$2,050. Mr. West intends to still further strengthen the dike by additions to the sides. While it no doubt is strong enough as it is, he wishes to make protection safe and doubly sure. The cost of the dike will be returned in a year or two in the greatly increased profit to be derived from the lands, for grasses and cultivation.—N. W. Farmer and Daryman.

On January 26, 1886, eight Italians, under direction of Count Porro, of Milan, left Naples on an expedition of discovery on the coast of Somali. On Saturday last all that remains of these brave men was landed and received at the arsenal of this city. Three skulls, four jawbones with their teeth, and forty-seven bones constitute that "all."—London Times.

It is suggested that to save washing, dishes should be made of paper and burnt after each meal. Plates, cups and saucers of this material could be manufactured very cheaply, and the adoption of this idea would dispose of the most fatiguing part of household labor.

A Probable Extra Session.
WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—A number of senators are of the opinion that there will be a brief special session of the senate for consideration of executive business after March 4th, but as yet no action looking to that end has been taken by either the president or the senate.
The condition of the appropriation bills is as follows: The legislative appropriation is pending in the house; the sundry civil appropriation is not reported; the naval appropriation is in the house; the fortification appropriation is not reported; the army appropriation is a law; the military appropriation passed; the postoffice appropriation is in conference; the river and harbor appropriation is in the house with the senate amendments; the pension appropriation is in conference; the agricultural appropriation is in the senate; the diplomatic appropriation is in the senate committee on appropriations; the district of Columbia appropriation is the house committee with the senate amendments; the Indian appropriation is in the house committee with the senate amendments.
