MORE than two-thirds of the sailors employed in the United States have a wife of foreign birth.

THE Kansas house has passed a bill changing the name of St. John county to Logan. Some of the speakers in the debate were very bitter on St. John.

THE United States government has \$50,000 Springfield rifles stored away, and is still manufacturing the antiquated weapon at the rate of 40,000 per annum.

THE sultan of Turkey is preparing to call out the entire population of the empire between the ages of seventeen and forty, for military service, as he expects a Russian occupation of Bulgaria in the spring.

A GERMAN paper says that with a funnel of thick Manila paper about sixteen inches long and six to eight inches wide at the mouth, the smaller end being put into the opening of the receiver, one may talk in whispers through the telephone.

A NEW YORK dispatch says the Oregon and Transcontinental party will try to control the next Northern Pacific election, and that the lease of the O. R. & N. Co.'s property to the Union Pacific will not be made, because congress has not given the Union Pacific the right to make the lease.

THE Russian official organ, *Le Nord*, publishes an article on the general European situation, asserting that the insurmountable national aversion and recollections of the Berlin treaty forbid any lasting and serious understanding between Russia and Germany. Neither will Russia engage in war against Austria or England. For the present, the Bulgarian question recedes in the background, and the possibility of a Franco-German war becomes the paramount question. Russia wishes to remain free in order that if a Franco-German war should break out, to prevent Germany from annihilating France and upsetting the European equilibrium. Thus, without concluding any alliance with France, Russia will arrange so that the events of 1870 shall not recur. This time Germany will have to guard her eastern frontier with troops, and will not be allowed to destroy France. Russia's eyes are fixed on the Rhine. This article and the last sentiment create a great sensation throughout Europe.

THE aggregate increase to the naval appropriation bill by the senate committee on appropriations is between \$20,000,000 and \$22,000,000, but inasmuch as the largest expenditure covers a period of five years, it is estimated that the additional appropriation for the next fiscal year will not exceed \$6,000,000, which will raise the aggregate expenditure for the year to between \$31,000,000 and \$32,000,800. The senate committee strikes out the house provision of \$2,740,000 for two steel cruisers, and substitutes an appropriation of \$9,000,000 for six protected steel cruisers, and \$1,200,000 to pay premiums for extra speed of the same. It also appropriates \$2,880,000 for armament of these vessels. An appropriation of \$6,000,000 is made for the construction of heavily armed vessels, floating batteries and rams, and of \$2,000,000 for their armament. Eight hundred thousand is appropriated for the construction of light draft gunboats, \$720,000 for torpedo boats, \$600,000 for torpedo and torpedo appliances, \$112,000 for the purchase of the *Destroyer*, and \$10,000 for her care and operation.
