Canadian Pacific Steamer Line.

NEW YORK, March 2 .- The Canadian Pacific railway, to which Paints, Oils, and Varnish, was recently chartered the Cunard steamships Parthia, Batavia and Abyssinia for the Pacific trade, has arranged to start the first line from Vancouver to Japan and China ports. The Parthia will be the pioneer steamer on the line, leaving Hong Kong by way of Hiogo and Yokama for Vancouver. The vessels will run monthly until the new steamships are built. The line will connect with the Peninsalar, Oriental and Messageries maritime lines in the East India trade.
