If prohibition is a failure in Kansas, who sells the liquor? Some say the drug stores sell. Then of course we must expect to find a great increase in the num-GOOD A QUALITY OF BEER ber of drug stores to make up for the deficiency in saloons. But there is no such increase. In Kansas, as in Oregon, every drug store and every saloon is compelled to take out a United States license to sell liquors. Now let us compare Kansas with Oregon in this respect. In Oregon there is one license to every 131 souls; in Kansas there is one to every 608 souls.

How about taxes? The saleon causes four-fifths of our crime. It is the crime that causes our taxes here in Clatsop county as elsewhere. So when we have abolished the saloon we reduce the taxes, do we? Yes, that's it. Here in Clatsop county, with about sixty saloons, our taxes (not including city taxes) are about \$5 to \$6 per capita; in prohibition Kansas, 20 cents per capita; in prohibition Maine they are 10 cents per capita. Prohibition Vermont has a 10 cent tax, while high license Illinois has a \$7 per capita tax.
