The Oar Frightened.

NEW YORK, March 16.—The Star's London cablegram says: In consequence of the plot to assassinate the czar, the imperial palace has been placed under charge of secret police. Attendants of the imperial family are under strict surveillance, and guards consisting of picked men are replaced at outer entrances, in corridors and at approaches to the imperial apartments, and the lines of sentries are doubled. Specials represent that great excitement exists throughout Russia. A large number of domiciliary visits were made to private residences of government officers and merchants and extensive seizures of documents effected. Evidence is accumulating that the conspiracy is more dangerous than ever discovered in Russia before. Among the documents of the students on whose persons bombs were found, was one of them declaring that a revolutionary proclamation would shortly be issued and calling on the people to rise in defense of their liberty and establish a government based on the will of the nation. In Vienna it is the general opinion that the discovery of the plot has immensely strengthened the war party.

AN interesting question now is: Did Hen. Owen "ring in" on the California member of congress a lot of lofty rim rock and high lava hills in Oregon for swamp lands? It has always been suspected that in Hen. there were vast possibilities of deception. The high lava hills may not be worth much to the United States, and they are likely to be worth as little to the man to whom Hen. sold them as swamp land; but the transaction shows at least that Hen is an original "operator." He follows no beaten track of fraud. That he scorns. He is one of those who, if they commit oldest sins, will do so in newest kinds of ways, so as to save appearance of honor and respectability.—Oregonian
