Two Vessels to Be Built. WASHINGTON, March 16.—The naval department is about to begin preparation of plans for two 1,700 ton gunboats for which provision was made by the last congress.

Inasmuch as these boats will be patterned after the gunboats now in process of construction, the work of the department will be much lighter than if gunboats of a new design had been ordered, as it will only be necessary to duplicate the drawings already made.

The limit of the contract price of the new vessels is \$550,000 each.
