SOME RAILROAD BUILDING.
Tricks of Diamond Smugglers.
Several New Lines Proposed During the Present Year.
"Most of the railroad building in the northwest during 1887 will be done in Washington territory and in eastern Oregon," said a gentleman who pretends to know, to the News. "Work will be pushed rapidly on the Seattle and Lake Shore and the Cascade branch of the Northern Pacific will be ready in six weeks, via the switch back.
"Among the railroad schemes on foot for which surveys are made, is the building of a line from Belmont, W. T., through Garfield, Palouse City and Pullman to Genesee, I. T., passing through a rich farming country.
"Again, it is intended to reach the Cœur d'Alene mines either by building from Cœur d'Alene City, or from Spangle, on the Spokane & Palouse branch. By the latter route the distance is forty-five miles.
"A system of lines that will add greatly to the transportation facilities of eastern Oregon and Washington branches off from the Spokane & Palouse at a point eight miles south of Pullman, and runs westerly parallel with the Snake river to Riparia. At this point the line will cross to Eureka flat, thence easterly to the neighborhood of Alto, thence south to Whetstone Hollow, a branch continuing on to Covello. The main line will run to Waitsburg, up Copel creek to Dixie, thence along the foothills to Walla Walla, a very important shipping city, thence east of the O. R. & N. line along the foothills to Milton, and thence to Wallula. Branches run from Milton to Centerville and Weston. Another proposed line will leave Wallula Junction, go up Vansycle canyon to Helix and fork, one branch for Pendleton and another for Centerville.
"These proposed roads go right into the wheat raising country and drain up much of the trade enjoyed by the O. R. & N. Co. Any wheat or other freight intended for the O. R. & N. Co. will have to cross the new lines to reach that company. From Waitsburg to Walla Walla the proposed line has the advantage over the O. R. & N., being twelve miles farther east into the grain region.
"The O. R. & N. Co. has received the right of way for a line from Prescott to Eureka Flat, a distance of "eighteen miles, and will undoubtedly build this year.
"The O. & C. will be finished so that trains will be able to run from San Francisco to Portland in May. In fact I think that the northwest is beginning to get a few railways, but I hope none too many for the amount of trade in the country."

Tricks of Diamond Smugglers.
"Please to hold my baby while my husband helps me to open my trunks; he will be quite good if you will shake his rattle," said a lady passenger to the officer who was waiting to look over her traveling gear. And that officer good humoredly did as he was requested, shaking the rattle to the great delight of the little one. The rattle in question, which, fastened to a ribbon, was tied to the child's waist, was filled with gems of greatest value, a mode of smuggling that at the time was too simple for detection. A clever female, attired in the costume of a sister of mercy, was passed over by the officers because she had no luggage worth examining. She possessed, however, a fine string of beads, which, with downcast eyes, she kept telling. Safe on land, she was affectionately welcomed by two persons dressed in costumes similar to her own. Need it be told that she was a smuggler, and that her beads were so constructed that each held a diamond weighing seven or eight carats? Another ingenious person hit upon the plan of placing a few precious stones in a toy kaleidoscope, which had been given to a child, who carried it ashore in safety. A number of homing pigeons kept in cages, and purchased at a village in Belgium and brought to the United States by way of Havre, also played a profitable part, each of the pigeons being freighted with a cargo of exquisite gems, concealed in quills, and carefully fastened to the message bearing dove. An extensive system of diamond smuggling was at one time carried on from Canadian ground by the aid of the homing pigeons. The discovery of this illicit trade was made accidentally by a farmer, who happened to shoot one of the birds, and examining it found that there was fastened to its leg a quill containing a number of diamonds. A clew being obtained, the local habitations of the pigeon proprietors was discovered and their mode of business put an end to. The scheme, stated simply, was to fly every week or ten days a flock of a dozen or fifteen pigeons, each carrying about half a dozen gems. As the duty on diamonds amounts to 10 per cent., the trouble taken to smuggle these gems into the United States does not seem so very remarkable. The value of the precious stones honestly imported into the United States is between \$8,000,000 and \$9,000,000 per annum, and it has been calculated that gems to half that sum escape payment of duty.

As to dehorning cattle, Prof. Wallace says the best time to dehorn is at one month old. The "embryo of the horn" should be cut out with a sharp knife, close to the skin, taking a little skin with it.
