The project of building a railroad along our beach between this place and Ilwaco has attracted no little attention during the past three years. It now aceds some one of energy and a few thousand dollars in money, to take hold of the proposition and raise a company and build the road. It will pay. It will only take eighteen miles of the road bed, which at a cost of \$5,000 a mile, will make \$90,000. For \$100,000 it can be built and equipped ready for business. The next thing to consider is, will it pay? The expense will not amount to more than \$700 month including all repairs; interest at 8 per cent. on capital stock, \$666 per month, or a total of \$1,366 per month. Now there are at least 10,000 persons who come to Ilwaco every summer, 90 per cent, of which would go over the road and back at least once, which would make \$18,000; say 4,000 others go over the road during the year, \$4,000, 20,000 sacks oysters at 20 cents, \$4,000; miscellaneous freight, express and mail, \$5,000 more, making a total of \$31,000. Deducting the income from the the expense of \$16,392, we have \$14,608, as a net profit, over and above the interest of 8 per cent.
