GERMAN PEACE PROSPECTS.

BERLIN, March 23.—The emperor's proclamation to the German people thanking them for their expressions of devotion, of joy at the 90th anniversary of his birth, is couched in words expressive of the profoundest emotion. The document contains a long review of the emperor's life. The kaiser dwells on the experiences of his youth, the wonderful help God vouchsafed him, and prays he may be able to deserve, during the short remainder of his life, the blessings of peace.

The kaiser's expressions of belief in the maintenance of peace are everywhere the subject of comment. At Prince Bismarck's dinner it was the common topic of conversation. The general opinion is that the crisis is over and that a period of quiet is commencing.

Prince Bismarck said to a foreign minister: "I rejoice on account of the emperor's happy anniversary, and especially that the political horizon is now being cleared."

It is reported that Grand Duke Vladimir told the emperor that the czar had authorized him to declare that he would do all in his power to maintain the traditional policy of Russia, namely, a perfect understanding with Germany. M. Flourens, French minister of foreign affairs, in the name of President Grevy and the French government, sent the emperor congratulations. Gen. Cardoba, of Spain, and Gen. Saarnheiro, of Portugal, who came as special envoys to represent their respective governments, have been decorated with the cordon of the order of the Red Eagle.

Very Wise Economy. Tuesday evening W. L. Powell, superintendent of the Neah Bay Indian agency, returned to Tacoma. Mr. Powell said that the government telegraph line between Port Angeles and Tatoosh island, upon which Cape Flattery lighthouse is located, has been discontinued, much to the regret of captains and steamboat men.

Superintendent Bell, of Port Angeles, received orders the latter part of last week to close the lines. Angeles is about sixty miles from the cape, and particularly to captains of tug boats is the closing up of the line a source of regret. Hereafter they could run into Neah bay and telegraph to any part of the country. Again, at Port Townsend, several times through the day, weather reports were telegraphed from the cape, besides the arrival and departure of all ships and steamers rounding Cape Flattery.—Tacoma Ledger.

The Regular Business. The agricultural horse trot will come off at Salem about the usual time this fall. The board of managers publishes a programme of fifteen races, the list comprising the "Salutation stake," "Oregon Derby," "Juvenile stake," a "Free-for-all," "Farewell stake" and "Good-bye handicap," giving gamblers and horse jockeys the finest variety upon which to exercise their peculiar skill ever presented under the auspices of the State Agricultural society, and at the expense of state funds. There are besides some "breeders' stakes" and minor "trot" in which the poky class known as "farmers" will, it is supposed, take some interest. The "purse" to support these attractions is large, the aggregate being up among the thousands.—Telegram.

Floods in Dakota.

ST. PAUL, March 23.—A special to the Pioneer Press from Bismarck, says that all attempts to break the Sibley island gorge by dynamite have been unavailing. A man was seen to-day riding down the river on a cake of ice, frantically calling for help, but it was impossible to assist him. Twelve families near Silvonka have had most dreadful experiences. After being on the roofs twenty-four hours, a thin coat formed over the river and on this they walked to the shore two miles, some breaking through several times, but were rescued. Fort Lincoln army officers here are still of the opinion that many people opposite the post on the lowlands south of the city perished in the flood. This belief is becoming prevalent. As the reports come in from the remote river districts the story of suffering and loss of life is intensified.

Six Men Hanged. LONDON, March 23.—It is reported that the six persons captured Sunday, and who were connected with the recent plot to assassinate the czar, were hanged Monday. Dagaroff, the man who murdered Lieutenant-Colonel Sudekyn, chief of police, three years ago, who was suspected of having plotted against the czar's life, is said to be one of the six.

Trying it Again. PARIS, March 23.—Le Paris publishes a telegram from Lemberg, the capital of Galicia, Austria, which says that on the 15th of March an attempt was made to upset a train conveying the czar and czarina to St. Petersburg on their return from a visit to the Grand Duke Vladimir.
