Fleetwood, Wildwood, Rip Van Winkle, Michigan, and many more that I might mention. Some of them are good boats, and some were no good. I learned the other day in Portland, that two-and probably three-additional small tugs were being fitted up over there to be brought around to the Sound. One of them is the Union, but the names of the others I have forgotten. Your cap-tain Elias, of the steamer Helen, has bonded a hull and house of a steamer at Astoria, and if he can make satisfactory arrangements to have her brought around he will do so, and either take the machinery out of the Helen and put it into the larger boat, or sell the Helen and have more powerful machinery put into the larger boat. I met him in Astoria, and he told me the Helen was too small for his rapidly growing trade on the Port Washington route. He has been trying to arrange with the Oregon Improvement Company to have one of the colliers tow his new steamer around to the Sound, but his negotiations in that regard do not seem to pan out very well. 
