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THE INTERSTATE COMMERCE LAW
First Workings of the New Measure.

NEW YORK, April 6.—Commissioner Pierson has explained the position of the trunk lines as follows: "Monday we began to receive dispatches from roads west and more came to-day, signifying the companies' willingness to come in with us. Our meeting read the telegrams and then voted to issue no more coupon tickets over roads which do not agree to stop paying commission. When no tickets issue no baggage will be checked through. It is not a boycott, but we have to do it to maintain the law. We have to make-de novo contracts and we propose to secure ourselves as we would have done twenty years ago had we been wise. With a few exceptions the roads which are not with us are not important. We have all the trunk lines, the roads of the Central Traffic association, all the southern association's roads and the far western lines. The main hitch in the arrangements has been on the amalgamated western roads. Two lines leading to Kansas City from the east have not yet notified us of their intention; neither has the Canadian Pacific. Tickets over its road will be taken off to-day by our company.

With the exception of the Canadian road, all the transcontinental lines agreed to stopping commission. So we have all roads of any importance in New England. The practical result of this railroad war, so far as the traveler starting from the east is concerned, will be that he will be able to buy tickets to points on lines outside our commission, paying the companies to check his baggage to those points. When he gets in such a road's territory he will have to buy a ticket again and get his effects rechecked. In objection to the roads will undoubtedly retaliate. When a traveler starts from home he will have the same trouble over again. The trunk lines and their allies will depend upon the resulting loss through travel to bring the stubborn roads over and force them to give up commissions.

Emigrant tickets are still for sale in this city at emigrant rates. The question of condemning them was not taken up yesterday, as it was thought to be very puzzling. To increase rates too soon would undoubtedly bear heavily upon many immigrants. If these tickets are sold, it must be open and public. No railroad managers are anxious to undertake the job of transporting immigrants and citizens in the same cars. They agreed yesterday to take up all through tickets issued by trunk lines placed in the hands of other roads, unless the company holding the tickets would assume the liability for them."

The passenger agents will not likely meet again for some weeks. WASHINGTON, April 6.—A petition has been received by the interstate commerce commissioners to-day from the general manager of the South Carolina Railway, for relief from the operations of the fourth section (long and short haul section) of the interstate commerce law. A petition having a like purpose has been received from the general manager of the Georgia Pacific Railway company. The commissioners were in conference two hours or more this morning over petitions for a suspension of the long and short haul provision, but took a recess without having reached a conclusion. They will reassemble this afternoon and continue consideration of the subject.

NEW YORK, April 6.—A member of the clipper freight firm of Van Vleck & Co., said yesterday regarding the effect of the interstate commerce law: "It will help large houses, but will knock the smaller under. The latter cannot possibly compete with the big firms in shipping goods by rail. The bill will practically tend to throw business back into the old channels. At any rate it will put it on a sounder business basis. Merchants of all kinds are willing to pay fair prices for freight, but it must be uniform. This wholesale cutting of rates should be stopped. Our rates average from 40 to 75 cents per hundred pounds. The Pacific Mail's lowest is from \$1 to \$2 per 100. We do not expect much business yet. Merchants are tired of shipping, and business is going to be dull for awhile at least."

CHICAGO, April 6.—The war between the western and eastern railroads now extends to freight as well as passengers. All through billing of freight between points in the east and Missouri river points via Chicago, has been stopped. Eastern roads charge local rates to Chicago, and local rates are added from Chicago and western points, which of course makes rates via Chicago materially higher than via St. Louis. Besides all freight from the east has to be rebilled at Chicago, which is an additional embarrassment. Roads running west from Chicago are determined, it is said, to resist the demands of eastern lines with all the means in their power.

PHILADELPHIA, April 6.—The Loebel iron company's furnace and the furnace of the Paxton iron works of Harrisburg, have shut down, and the International nail works will also cease operations on account of the freight rate changes resulting from the interstate commerce bill. This throws 750 men out of employment.
