The Governors of Oregon.

The following are the names of the governors of Oregon arranged in chronological order:
Territorial—George Abernethy, 1845-1849; General Joseph Lane March to August, 1849; Major John P. Gaines, 1849-1853; Gen. Joseph Lane, March to July, 1853; John W. Davis, November, 1853, to August 1, 1854; Geo. I. Curry, 1854 to 1859.
State—John Whiteaker, 1859-1862; Addison C. Gibbs, 1862-1866; Geo. L. Wood, 1866-1870; LaFayette F. Grover, 1870-1877; S. F. Chadwick, 1877-1878; W. W. Thayer, 1878-1882; Z. F. Moody, 1882-1886; Sylvester Penneyer, 1887-1891.

Of the above all the territorial governors are dead, also Addison C. Gibbs of the state executives. Abernethy came to Oregon in 1840 and was one of the originators of the provisional government which was in force until the organization of the territorial government. He died in 1877. General Lane was Democratic candidate for vice president on the Breckinridge ticket in 1860, and at the opening of the civil war threw his influence in favor of the south. He refrained from taking an active part in the effort to disunite the republic, and retired to Roseburg, where he died in April, 1881. Gaines was reported to have been killed by Indians near Fort Boise, Idaho, in 1854. Nothing further is known of his fate. George L. Curry died in Portland, July 28, 1878; Governor Davis resigned August 5, 1854, and left for his home in Indiana, where he subsequently died.

Of the state governors, John Whiteaker is collector of internal revenue in Portland; Addison C. Gibbs died in London, England, December 30, 1886. George L. Woods is practicing law at Spokane Falls; LaFayette F. Grover resides in Portland, and practices law; S. F. Chadwick resides at Salem, and is a lawyer; W. W. Thayer is a supreme judge; Z. F. Moody has returned to The Dalles, his former home.

Of the dead, General Lane lived the longest. He was nearly eighty years at his death. Abernethy was 70, Gibbs had rounded 61, Davis 60, Curry 58 and Gaines 50.
Whiteaker will be 67 on May 4th, Woods is 55 or 56 and Moody will be 55 on May 27th. Grover is well advanced in years; Thayer is 57 or 58, and Chadwick about 60. Sylvester Penneyer, the present governor, is 54.

Grover is the only Oregon governor who has been elected two terms, but he did not serve them, being elected United States senator before the close of his second term. Governor Woods was also governor of Utah, receiving the appointment of that office from President Grant.

The Great National Puzzle.

New York, April 19.—The Post says editorially: When the interstate commerce bill was pending we pointed out the fact that the long and short haul clauses would operate as an interstate protective tariff, and Ohio wool growers have not been slow to perceive its value in this sense. They are said to be preparing a protest against granting the petition of California wool growers, who have asked that the clause in question be suspended as to their product, representing that its enforcement would be absolutely ruinous to their industry. Ohio wool growers are alive to this fact. Also they are accordingly strenuous in insisting that the law be strictly enforced.

Producers of raisins in California have discovered that the commerce act serves to nullify the tariff on foreign raisins by increasing the freight charge to eastern markets to a point equal to customs duty.

Sugar refiners on the Pacific coast, who have been enabled, by getting their raw sugar from the Hawaiian islands free of duty, to send their products as far east as St. Louis, have likewise struck a snag in the commerce act and put in a petition that the long haul clause be suspended as regards sugar, to which eastern refiners, who pay duties equal to 100 per cent. ad valorem on raw sugar, have very properly objected.

The salmon canners of the Columbia river will be heard from soon, and it will be in order then for fishermen on the Atlantic coast to stand up for a strict construction of the law.

The possibilities of the commerce act as an interstate protective tariff are only beginning to be understood.

Temporary orders were made suspending the fourth section of the act on the application of the Norfolk & Southern Railroad company and the Cincinnati, New Orleans & Texas railroad, as to points south of the Ohio and east of the Mississippi.
