### New Way to Seal Cans.

An ingenious improvement, in the manufacture of tin cans for preserved food is being introduced, the plan consisting in so forming the lid that it is merely pressed on and the can is hermetically sealed, so that no internal pressure can remove the lid Water boiled in a tin thus closed has failed to force it off, although the steam pressure has burst the can itself. A penny piece, however, used as a lever by being placed under a rim formed around the top of the fits is formed at a very slight angle from the vertical, and the rim of the lid is made at a corresponding angle, no solder being used to form the joint. By means of this arrangement, therefore, the opening of cans is ren-dered a remarkably clean, quick and simple operation, contrast-ing greatly in these respects with the inconvenient method of opening now




