MIXING RAILROAD BRIDGES.

The reason why the Oregon and California railroad has not yet pushed its way across the Klamath river was learned by a reporter yesterday. It is an old story, but one which a railroad man who can account for the curious mixing up freight while in transit, will readily believe. The bridge over the Klamath will probably be finished by May 1st, and there will remain only twenty-nine miles of track to build to complete the line to a connection with the California and Oregon at Ashland .- S.
