Rough weather was reported out-side yesterday; there is little moving in shipping; the canneries report a light catch so far in May; though well informed authorities say that there were just as many salmon in the river this year in April as any other April in the history of the business

The coast steamer McArthur, Capt. J. C. Burnett, seven days from San Francisco, arrived in yesterday morning. There is a surveying party on board, to make a hydrographic survey of Tillamook, the Nehalem river, Nestucca and Shoalwater bays; taking soundings, determining channels, etc.

A fine illustration of a "long haul' charge under the interstate commrce law, occurred the other day, says the Ledger, when a carlcad of oil in boxes arrived in Tacoma from the Standard Oil company of Cleveland. The oil was consigned to their agent here. Its cost was over \$600 and the freight rate was over \$700.

Capt. Johnson, of the schooner General Banning, reports in San Francisco that the outer bar buoy, Gray's harbor, is half a mile to the northward of the channel. The buoy is right in the north breakers. Capt. Johnson reports that he lost both anchors and all his chain on account of the buoy being out of position.






