The Aggressive Canadian Pacific.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 9.—The war on sugar rates begun by the Canadian Pacific is being extended into the American lines with a vengeance. There were shipped from local refineries this week 8,000 barrels of sugar, which will go to Omaha over the Canadian Pacific and connecting lines. This enormous shipment will traverse a distance by rail and water of over three thousand miles, or nearly double that by the Central and Union Pacific, which run overland direct from this city. The rate made on the shipment is 65 cents a hundred pounds, and it is believed that the proportion received by the Canadian Pacific is less than two mills per ton to a mile, which leaves a very small margin of profit over operating expenses. It is the lowest rate yet made by the line to any shipper, and approximates the enormous reductions made by the Southern Pacific company in competition with the Pacific Mail for New York business.

Notwithstanding reductions made by American overland lines, there is still a difference of 10 cents a hundred in favor of the Canadian Pacific shippers, the new transcontinental rate being 75 cents a hundred pounds.

There still remains among all the transcontinental lines a fear that the Canadian Pacific will capture the Pacific coast trade of Chicago. The fact that a syndicate had been formed to run a line of boats between Port Arthur on the Canadian Pacific and Chicago over Lakes Superior and Michigan, to compete for all classes of Pacific coast freight, was the first signal of alarm to the American lines. As there are over 700 miles of cheap water transportation by this new route, the rates the Canadian Pacific will be able to make are calculated to be at least 35 per cent. lower than those of the American lines. When the line is put in operation it is thought here that it will give the sharpest blow to the other routes that they have ever received, and a grand tumble of rates will result.

Will Make A Proposition.
WALWA WALWA, May 9.—(An information that president Harris and several directors of the Northern Pacific would be here within fifteen days, a meeting of farmers and citizens this afternoon adopted a proposition to offer free right of way and a bonus of \$75,000 if the company will build a line to Walwala Junction and agree to carry wheat to the Puget sound for \$4 a ton. Ten thousand dollars was subscribed on the spot, and a committee was appointed to solicit the remainder. A considerable part of the right of way is already donated.

The Dish Cloth.

A clean dish cloth, hung up to dry when the work is finished, is a sight by which a good worker may be known. Apropos of materials suitable for dish cloths, an exchange publishes the following, which is worthy of consideration:

"There is nothing better for dish cloths than old or cheap or part worn cotton flannel. It makes a sensible dish cloth—wringing dry and wiping nicely."

"Don't do it. At least stop to think of it a moment, and you won't. Old cotton flannel that has been worn next the body two or three seasons is not very nice for dish cloths, no matter how clean it is washed. Don't you remember what Beecher said about wrapping butter in the tails of old shirts when he was an agricultural editor, more than forty years ago? He said he wanted at least to know whose shirts he was eating. No, no. Get always new towels for your dish cloths and dish wipers. No matter how cheap and coarse they are, get them. It's the old dirty gussets or drawer legs come near the dishes off which you eat your food. Be particular about whose shirt you are eating."

Thought to Be a Slave.

WASHINGTON, May 9.—It comes out to day that the United States corvette *Alliance*, captain MacGregor, which left New York last November, has a secret mission to perform. She is ordered to seize the schooner *Emma Jane* and make prisoners of her master and crew and send her to the United States in charge of a prize crew. The seizure is ordered upon reports that after fitting out in the United States as a whaler, she was taken, contrary to orders, to Joahanna Island on the coast of Massachusetts and sold for a trifle to Dr. Wilson, a planter. It is charged Wilson has used her to carry sugar and it is suspected she is also employed in the slave trade.
