Supreme Court Decisions.

SALEM, May 11.—The supreme court yesterday decided two cases. Crook county, respondent, vs. John T. Bushnell et al., appellants. This was a case where the bondsmen of Bushnell, ex-treasurer of Crook county, were sued to recover a sum of money which Bushnell failed to account for when he delivered the office over to his successor. The county obtained a verdict in the lower court, but judgment is reversed in the supreme court. The second is the case of Aura M. Raley and Oliver I. Johns, appellants, vs. Umatilla county, respondent. This is a case where certain property in Pendleton was decided to Umatilla county, the deed containing a provision that the county must erect and maintain a college thereon. Instead a public school building was built by the school district. The heirs of the grantor now claim that the title is void because of the failure of the county to comply with the conditions. This case is important, as holding, first, as to the capacity of a county to hold real estate, and, second, the rule of law as applied to conditions subsequent. The court maintains that a public corporation can hold property in trust for beneficial purposes, and that it was impossible for the county to fulfill the conditions of the deed, an appropriation of money for the maintenance of a college being out of its power. Therefore, according to rule of law, the deed is not void. The decision of the lower court is sustained.

The Nanaimo Disaster.

SEATTLE, May 11.—Territorial mine inspector Watson returned to this city yesterday on the steamer *North Pacific* from Victoria and Nanaimo, where he had been making an inspection of the disaster which occurred a few days ago. He said that as compared with the great mine horror in Scotland some years ago the explosion at Nanaimo was not near so heavy, but more lives were lost here than there. Fifty-two bodies had been taken out in the last two days, and nearly every minute in the day a funeral had been seen passing along the street. Burials are taking place as fast as bodies are brought out of the mine. The proportion of widows is very great to the number killed, there being fifty-four out of the 108 killed who were married and had families dependent upon them. An official inspection of the mine for the purpose of learning the cause of the explosion will be made in about two weeks.

The directors are now in Visalia, and it is understood they will arrange matters so as to satisfy the people. If this is not done serious trouble may occur as all are prepared to open the head gates of the "Seventy-Six" canal regardless of the injunction of Judge Cross. The farmers need water and crops are suffering to such an extent that people in this section regard the matter as a question of bread or no bread. The following was displayed on the streets of Traver to-day: "Water we might have had; water we should have had; water we could have had; water we can have; water we must have; water we will have."

A Vatican Decision.

NEW YORK, May 11.—Bishop Ireland, of St. Paul, in an interview with a *Tribune* reporter to-day, said: "It is decided in Rome that the Knights of Labor are not to be condemned, and all censures against them, such as those formerly existing in Canada, have been withdrawn, but this action is negative. No positive approval was asked for or will be given, and, of course, should the Knights in the future do anything as a society contrary to justice or the law of the church, they will be liable to condemnation. So far there has been no cause for condemnation."
