Twenty-Five Million Dollars Discovered

LONDON, May 16 .- The financial secretary of India has advised the government of the discovery of an immense amount of treasure, estimated at over \$25,000,000, which had been secreted in the Palace Civalios by the late maha jarah. The treasure had been sunk in pits, under vaults, beneath the Zeenana. The secret was entrusted to a few confidential servants. The secretary was present when the treasure was unearthed After removing the earth to a depth of six feet, the workmen found great flagstones. Underneath, these several pits were filled to the brim with silver, chiefly freshly coined rupees. In each pit was a plate recording the amount of treasure, and the names of officials who assisted in secreting it. The Indian government has taken the hoard as a loan from the mahajarah. Native papers are protesting against this action. They say, had the mahajarah been an adult, instead of under a regency controlled by the government, he never would have invested his whole wealth in Indian securities. A question will be raised in parliament as to whether "investment" may not be another name for seizure.
