Ar the postal card factory in Castleton, Pa., between two and three tons of postal cards a day are manufactured the year round. The largest order ever filled for one city was 4,000,000 cards, or about twelve tons of paper, for New York city where they use about 6,000,000 cards a month. Chicago comes next, with about 3,000,000 cards in the same period. There are 450,000,000 manufac tured annually. 
