 PRESIDENTIAL TIMBER COM-
 PARED.

Gov. CURTIN, of Pennsylvania, who used to be a Republican, but who went into the Democratic ranks some years ago, makes the prediction that senator Sherman will head the Republican ticket and Cleveland the Democratic. The talk he hears of Blaine sounds ridiculous to him, and he predicts that the Pennsylvanians who are booming the man from Maine, will change their cry when they get into the nominating convention. In the campaign of 1884, he says the Democratic party had to fight against two strong influences. One was the fear of the policy that would follow the election of Cleveland, and the other was the uncertainty of Cleveland's ability in national matters, considering his limited experience in public life. This situation has been changed, Gov. Curtin claims, and the Democrats will enter the next campaign with all the strength of a conservative record of four years, and the Republicans will have to call upon a man just as sound and conservative to meet the issue. Gov. Curtin says it ought to appear to any politician and, in fact, to any citizen that senator Sherman, with his great strength and record, is the candidate for the Republicans to put up. With Blaine as a candidate, the governor believes that it would not be the old fight over again, but a new one.

C. S. SALOMAN, who was governor of Washington territory between 1870 and 1872, and who is now department commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, has aroused comment by the address he delivered at San Francisco on Memorial day. The closing words of the address were: "And now my friends and comrades, when I look upon this silent city of heroic dead, I must proclaim against the erection of monuments in honor of treason and traitors, under the folds of the American flag. When I strew my flowers upon the honored resting place for one who died that his country might live, I consider it sacrilegious to decorate at the same time the graves of men who died in an attempt to destroy and ruin the country for which we fought. While observance of this day is one of love and peace, and while we are all willing to forgive those who tried to bring shame, disgrace and ruin upon us, we cannot forget, and we must not let undue sentimentality make us forget, that there is a difference between the men who died as patriots and those who died as traitors."

WHY do people advertise births, marriages and deaths? is a question sometimes asked. Because to be born, to be married, and to die, are the three most important events that happen to the individual himself and because the advertisements of these events may furnish most important evidence hereafter in case of disputed succession to property. As a matter of fact there is nothing more interesting in any paper than its births, deaths and marriage column. It contains news of interest to everybody.

QUESTIONS of public policy arise, and, says the Boston Herald, the people divide upon them, forming parties. The issues make parties, and not the reverse. As old questions are settled and new ones arise, the old parties may keep the same names and seem to be the same, but they are constantly changing. There is but one real issue before the country to-day big enough to make parties upon, and that is the question of the tariff. all the rest is tradition and prejudice.

A MAN died of starvation in a Liverpool prison last week. He was arrested for alleged drunken-

ness, and died during the night in his cell. The sapient officer who ran him in was astounded on being informed by the police doctor that the man had died of starvation and that he was exhausted and not drunk when arrested. No wonder, says the St. Louis Globe-Democrat, the emigrant ships are crowded.

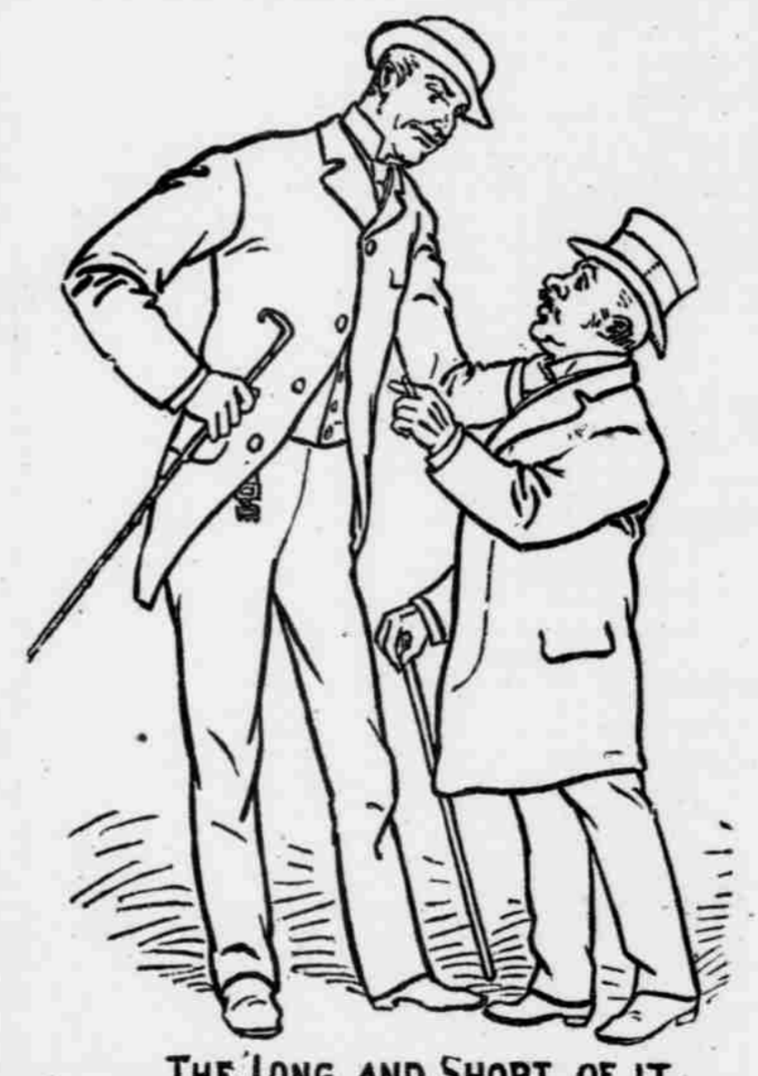
