THE BRITISH INVASION.

The Briton is invading this country at a rate which, within the memory of some now living, would have caused great political apprehension. For some time after the formation of our government there was a considerable minority of our citizens who declared that they had fought England but not the English form of government. It would have been dangerous to add by immigration to this formidable party, but that danger is long past. The growth of our own native population has belittled all possible immigration, and republican ideas have been slowly advancing in Great Britain itself. We can listen to-day to the words "God save the queen" unmoved by the emotions that shook our immediate forefathers, feeling that the politics which it confounds and the "knavish tricks" which it execrates are none of ours. The Briton comes to us, therefore, in increasing numbers, and we heed him not at all. A correspondent of the Chicago Times has drawn attention to some figures which have special interest in this connection. He says that in 1880 there were nearly 215,000 more Irish than British and Canadians in the United States. A deduction of 10 per cent for losses by death and otherwise would leave an Irish majority of 200,000. From the 1st of January, 1881, 393,000 Irish have come to this country, while 886,000 Britons and Canadians have been added to our population. Making proper allowance for death and other losses the Times's correspondent asserts that a British-Canadian majority of 240,000 is shown. The immigration from Great Britain is much more largely male than that from Ireland, and we have authority for the statement that it is the middle-class English who migrate. Of course, these figures will bear looking into, and other calculators may draw other deductions from them. But the fact remains that the Briton is becoming a more potent element in our social composition than is generally thought.

Under the allotment law of congress, which the secretary of the interior is carrying into operation, the Indians now on reservations, with the exception of five tribes, will be made farmers and citizens of the United States. Each Indian will have a farm of his own, which he cannot sell, but which he will be obliged to cultivate in order to earn a living.

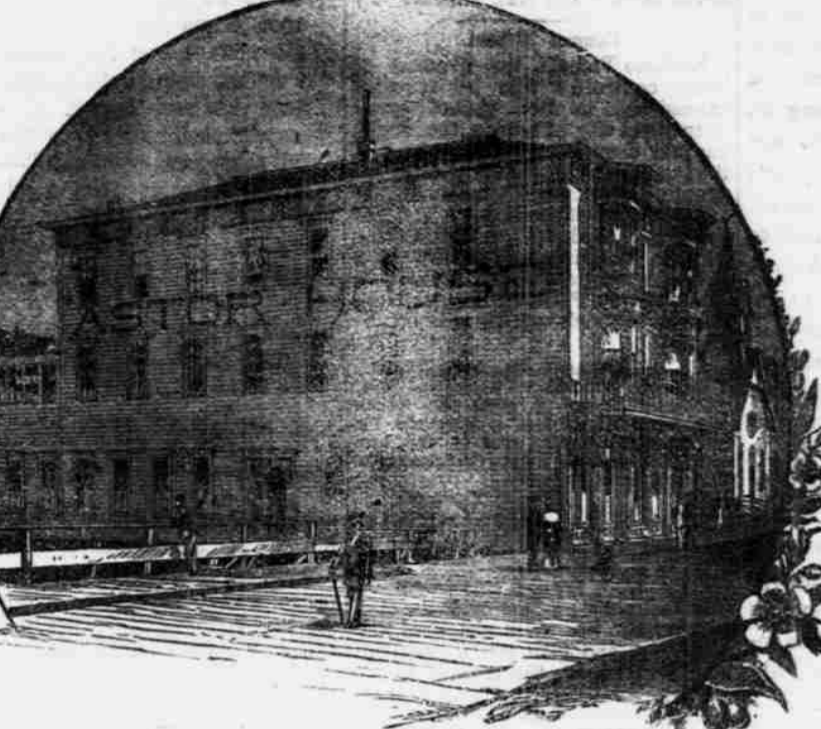
